MARKET DATES, HOURS AND LOCATION:

SUMMER SEASON

- Every Saturday, rain or shine, 9am to 1pm. May 13th through October 14th.
- The Common. First Street, Pittsfield, MA.

WINTER SEASON

- Second Saturday of each month, 9am to 1pm. November through April.

DEADLINES:

- Application deadline: Rolling.
- Payment deadline: One week in advance of first market day.

BOOTH FEES AND SIZES:

- Summer: Outdoor booths are approximately 10' x 10'. Vendors must provide their own set-up (tents, tables, etc). Winter: We provide tables for our youth vendors. Tables range in size depending on space each month.
- Youth booth is \$15 per day.

HEALTH INFORMATION:

Youth vendors selling food must be working in a commercial kitchen and have approval by the Pittsfield Board of Health.
